The Power of a Praying Church - Part 2

P.O.I.N.T. - Power Of Identity Naming Things

Review of Part 1: From Begging to Declaring

We explored Moses' encounter with God in Exodus 3, where God answered the question 'Who am I?' with a revelation: 'I AM.' We affirmed the phrase 'God is... therefore, I am' as a prophetic declaration of identity, alignment, and authority.

Breaking Down the Acronym: P.O.I.N.T.

P - Power

We don't pray for power—we pray from power. That power comes from knowing who we are in Christ.

Scriptures:

- Acts 1:8

O – Of (Ownership)

We are not praying to become something—we pray because we already are. Identity is not something we achieve; it's something we receive.

Scriptures:

- Romans 8:15-17
- Galatians 4:6-7
- Proverbs 3:5-6

I – Identity

True identity comes from God. We are made in His image and likeness. We pray effectively when we know who we are.

Scriptures:

- Genesis 1:26
- Psalm 82:6

- 1 John 4:17
- 2 Corinthians 5:17

N – Naming Things

Adam was given authority to name the animals—this was not just a task, it was a function of dominion. Naming is part of our spiritual authority.

Scriptures:

- Genesis 2:19-20
- Romans 4:17
- Proverbs 18:21

T – Targeted Prayers (Aim)

Like a laser pointer, our prayers must be aimed. Pray with clarity and confidence, not as a shot in the dark.
